

During the conference there will be ample opportunity to explore the BDA Museum and the BDA Library.

Situated at the heart of London's medical quarter, the British Dental Association is the professional association and trade union for dentists in the UK. Founded in 1880 by leading dental reformer Sir John Tomes, the BDA continues to provide collective representation, effective lobbying and championing higher standards for dentists and the nation's oral health.

The BDA Library houses an extensive collection of rare books dating from the 16th century collected by the dental historian, Lilian Lindsay. A librarian will be on hand on Saturday 8th to show you examples from the collection.

The BDA Museum holds the largest collection of dental heritage in the UK. Explore how human teeth were attached to ivory dentures, the development of dental services for the armed forces during the First World War and the oral health of London's past in our temporary exhibitions around the building.



Optional outing to the London Eye on a RouteMaster Bus on Sat 8th Oct 4.45pm -7pm

Travel on an iconic RouteMaster Bus across London to the 'London Eye'. Enjoy breath taking views of London from this giant Ferris Wheel on the Southbank of the Thames as the sun sets. £35 per person (including return bus travel to the BDA).
